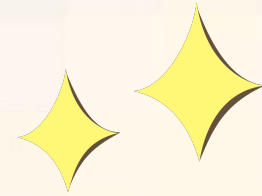
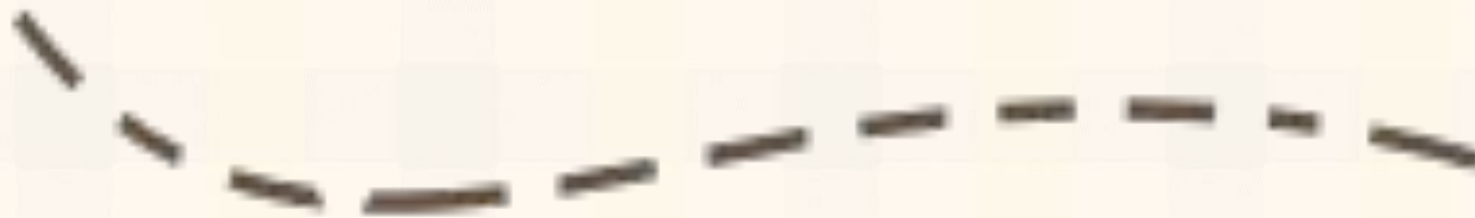

Homework



-  Homework is given on Fridays. This will be pages from their homework books. Homework is handed in the following Thursday. We mark it together on Fridays.
 -  Children write the date above the pages they need to complete.
 -  If children are finding it difficult to complete their homework at home, speak to the class teacher and we can arrange a time for it to be completed in school. We will give merit rewards for children who complete their homework consistently.

Home Reading

- Children will have a reading journal, similar to last year.
- If possible, encourage your child to record their own reading and parents/carers can sign at the end of the week.
- It needs to be in school every day, with their banded book. This is because we use this book for reading in school with adults as well.
- Teachers will check the planners every Friday.







Your child may bring home 2 books:

A 'levelled' reading scheme book. Your child should be able to read this title largely independently. Less confident readers should always read them aloud with a grown-up however.

A 'reading for pleasure' book of their own choosing from the library. Children will have a chance to return their library book and select a new one every Friday.





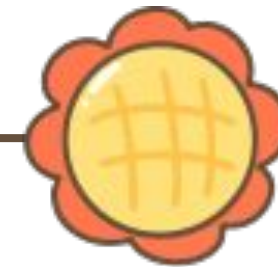

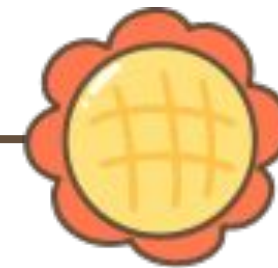
How can I help at home?





Read with your child as much as possible in a calm, quiet place. Ask them questions about the text.



Talk to your children about their learning- use the knowledge organisers we send home as a starting point.

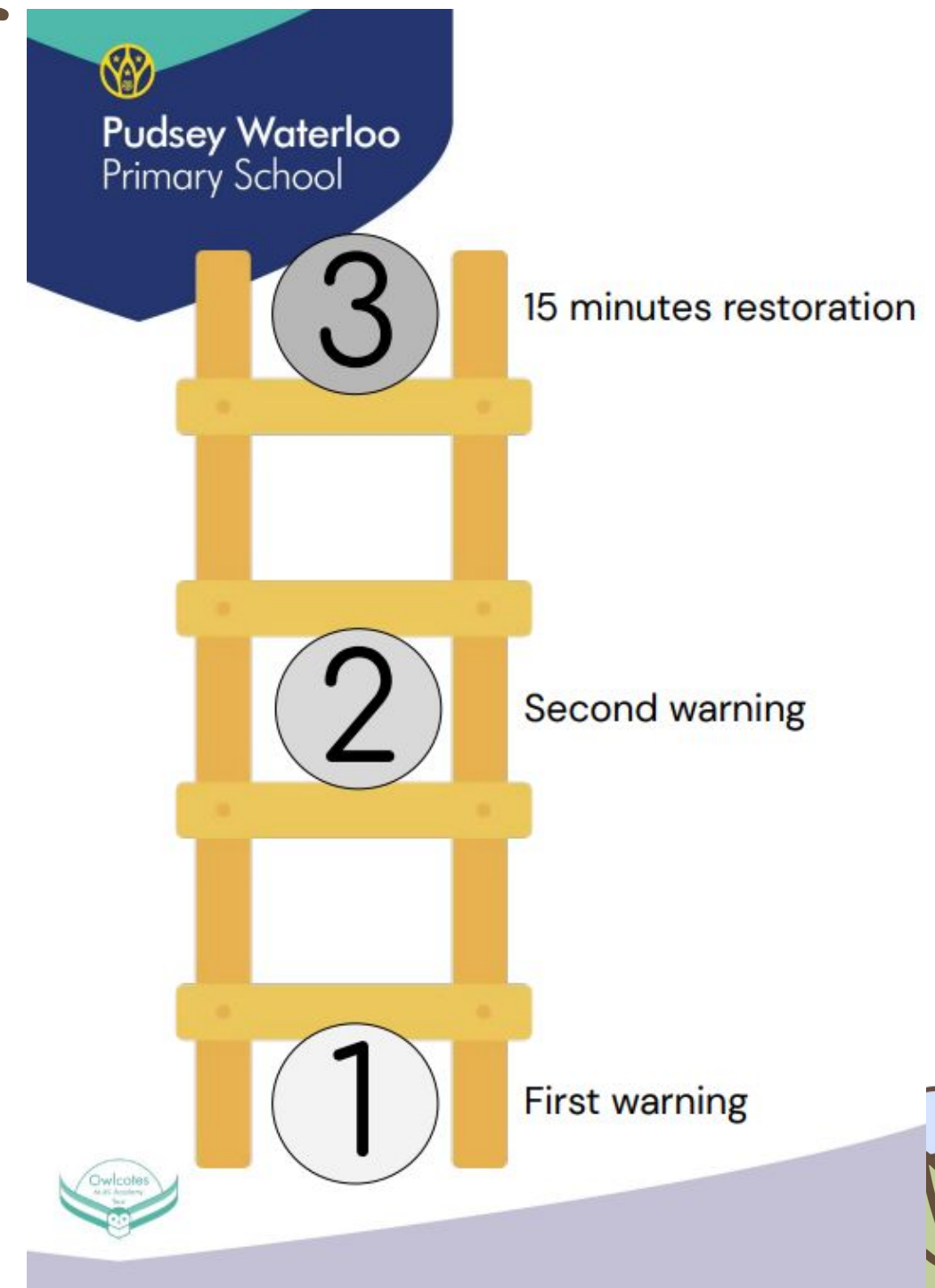


Encourage your child to complete their homework task and use TTRS/ Spelling Shed.



Behaviour

- We have a behaviour policy that we call “The Ladder”.
- Children receive a verbal reminder prior to moving onto level 1.
- If children reach level 3, they will have a 15 minute restoration session during playtime where they will discuss their behaviour with a member of staff.
- Some behaviours may cause children to go straight to Level 3 such as violent or threatening behaviour.











Merits

- Your child can receive a merit for great work or attitude and this will be recorded in their Reading Journal (at the front):
- 25 merits = Bronze Certificate
- 50 merits = Silver Certificate
- 75 merits = Gold Certificate
- 100 merits = Platinum Certificate





Uniform

-  ● During a normal school day, children need to wear school uniform including black school shoes.
 -  ● PE KIT: To be worn on Tuesday. The PE kit should be: a plain black/navy blue tracksuit with a plain white t-shirt and trainers (shorts if weather permitting).

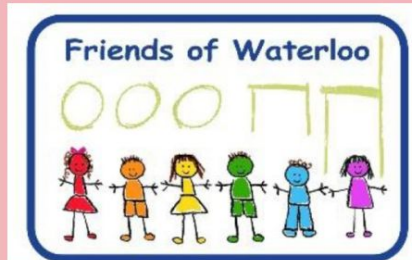
